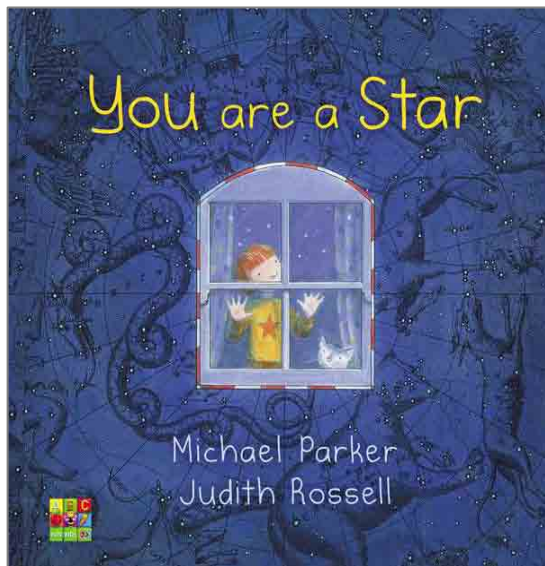
ABOUT THE AUTHOR:

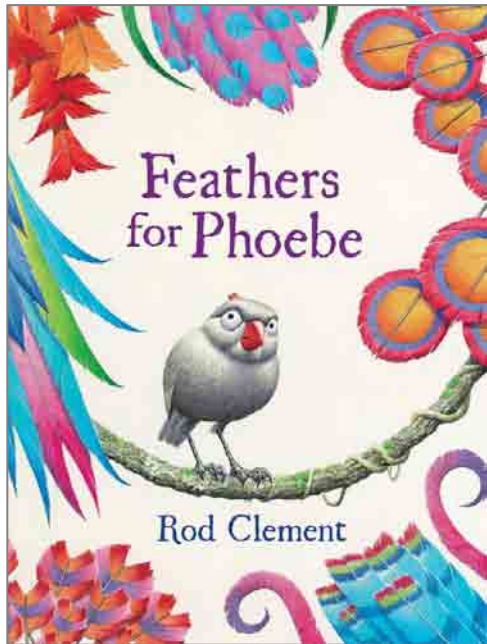
ABOUT THE AUTHOR:
